# Reading Project List

## Select One Project for your Newberry Medal Book

### Illustrated timeline

- Select 3 events from the story: 1 from the beginning, 1 from the middle, and 1 from the end
- Illustrate each event
- Explain what is happening in each event (A minimum of 5 complete sentences for each event)
- Place them in chronological order on your timeline

### Map

- Create a map showing at least 3 important places from the story
- Write a description of each location (A minimum of 3 complete sentences for each location)
- Explain why each place is important to the story (A minimum of 3 complete sentence for each location)

### Share your favorite scenes

- Illustrate at least 4 of your favorite scenes using art supplies or digitally create them using Google Slides
- Explain what you enjoyed about each scene (A minimum of 3 complete sentences for each scene)

### Become a character from the story!

- Create a video of yourself "in character" retelling the story from your point of view
- Be certain to talk about the challenges or adventures you faced, important people you encountered, and how you (as the character) felt at the end of the story

### Create a Diary/Journal Entry

- Select an important event from the story
- Pretend you are one of the characters who experienced that event
- Write a personal reflection about what happened and what you (as the character) were thinking and feeling at the time (A minimum of 12 complete sentences)

### Character Portrait

- Create a colorful drawing, painting, or figure depicting one of the main characters
- Write a character sketch of at least 12 complete sentences. Describe the character's personality and traits. Give examples of how he or she dealt with the challenges, people, and adventures he or she encountered in the story

### Retell the story in comic book or graphic novel format

- Use panes, call-outs, & color illustrations to retell the story in your own words
- There should be a minimum of 10 panes/scenes

### Create a book in a bag

- Choose at least 7 items that represent people, places, and events in the story and place them in the bag
- Create a key/legend that describes each item and its importance to the story (A minimum of 2 complete sentences per item)

### Create a mobile of the story

- Select at least 7 items that represent places, and events in the book and hang them from a hanger using yarn or string
- Create a key/legend that describes each item and its importance to the story (A minimum of 2 complete sentences per item)

### Write a friendly letter to the author

- Include:
  - Your opinion of the book. Did you enjoy reading it or not? Give examples explaining why
  - Your favorite part of the book and why
  - Questions you have about specific events and/or characters
  - A minimum of 10 complete sentences written in friendly letter format

### Video tape an interview with a character from the book

- Write the dialogue to be spoken during the interview (A minimum of 10 questions and answers)
- Recruit a friend or family member to be in the video with you. One of you will be the interviewer, and the other will be the character.
